WHO IS A MEMBER OF THE VATL EXECUTIVE FOR 2014

The VATL Executive for this year consists of Angelo Gasparini (Kangan), Paul Kloppenborg (William Angliss), Rachel Neumann (Sunraysia), Leanne Meere (Swinburne), Colin Sutherland (Chisholm) and Samantha Helfrich (Holmesglen).

VATL WORKING GROUPS

VATL has three working groups who meet regularly and run events on certain topics of interest.

Colin Sutherland leads the CASS group which covers Cataloguing, Acquisitions, Serials and Systems. The CASS group ran a workshop on 9 May 2014 at the NMIT Polytechnic in Prahran. Over 30 TAFE library staff. The day started with a presentation by Domenic lannello from RMIT who gave an overview of how RMIT University manages its e-resources. This was followed by practical demonstrations by Elena Barger from William Angliss on Google Analytics and managing a library blog. In the afternoon, Lynda O'Meara from SAI global provided an overview of SAI and also answered many questions about Standards subscriptions and the various options. Susan Bodernam (NMIT) and Stephen Harrison (Holmesglen) then presented case studies of their Institute's discovery layers and how these were implemented. The day finished with a lively debate: Discovery Layer – Yes (Susan and Stephen) or No (Colin Sutherland (Chisholm).

Samantha Helfrich leads the LIT group which focuses on literacy, information and technology. The LIT group is looking for new members to join the group. Membership on the LIT committee involves the planning and preparation of two workshops each year (one in the winter and one late spring). This is mainly achieved via email correspondence, with one or two face-to-face meetings to plan for each session. However, due to distance and conflicting work schedules, attendance at these meetings can be managed through remote access (Google hangouts, Skype, or web conferencing.) Additionally, there are some other projects that the committee may undertake, but again most of the communication for these will be via email.

Angelo Gasparini leads the MIG (Manager Interest Group) which has undergone a repositioning. MIG was formed to bring managers of TAFE libraries together. 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STRATEGIC PLAN

Every three years, VATL puts together a Strategic Plan. In late 2013, VATL ran a series of workshops to develop a plan for the years 2014-16. VATL wishes to thank TAFE library staff who attended the workshops held in November last year. Your input was valuable and much appreciated.

The VATL Executive collated the information and prepared a draft Strategic Plan which was discussed it at the last two meetings held in January and April. The VATL Executive came to the conclusion that rather than a plan, we should instead, embrace a Strategic Intent. This way, we can work to a direction rather than have actionable outcomes that has accountabilities, dates and outcomes that we will struggle to achieve through meeting only 3-4 times a year.

The Strategic Intent covers 4 key areas: advocacy, collaboration, professional development and communication.
